WHY REGULAR WORMING IS RISKING HORSE HEALTH - PROVIDED BY OUR LOCAL VET - HANNAH MITCHELL



In the last few years vets are starting to see a dramatic increase in worm associated disease, even in horses perceived to be 'wormed'. Whilst horses dying from worm burdens did become a thing of the past it unfortunately is becoming a very real risk for the future.

Regular and over-use of wormers (anthelmintics) has led to the development of anthelmintic resistance and damage to the ecosystem. Some worms can carry a gene which enables them to survive anthelmintic treatment. These worms then reproduce and, with no susceptible worms present to compete with them, the population of resistant worms dramatically increases. Whilst resistance is a widespread concern and everyone's problem, it develops specific to your pastures and therefore it is in all of our interests to prevent the situation worsening.

Regular interval dosing with anthelmintics is no longer justified and a more proactive and strategic approach must be taken. Worm egg counting (WEC) is very easy to perform and the results can be utilized to guide necessity of anthelmintic treatment. WEC should begin in March of each year and continue to October with individual horse samples collected every 8-12 weeks depending on level of risk.

Adult horses maintained on well managed pastures in a low stocking density are considered low risk, whereas horses on poorly managed pasture in high stocking density are considered higher risk. As the temperature starts to drop into winter the most common parasite – small redworms – hibernate (encyst) in the gut lining over winter. Without treatment these will erupt in the spring and with large burdens can cause severe disease most commonly diarrhoea and weight loss.

Historically advice has been to administer Equest Pramox during the winter months. This anthelmintic is the only one available with full efficacy against encysted redworm. The pramox part contains praziquantel which treats tapeworm. Since Equest is the only product effective against this stage it is vital that we reduce its use to slow down development of resistance.

WORMING - CONTINUED



Horses with low WECs over the season are unlikely to require this treatment and therefore discuss with your vet a lower risk alternative. It is also important not to use Equest at any other time of the year, unless advised by your vet OR as a quarantine treatment for new horses coming onto the yard.

Tapeworm should be tested or treated for at least once yearly. Testing for tapeworm is very simple using the EquiSal saliva test which can be performed by horse owners. Testing should only be performed if the horse has not received a tapeworm treatment within the last 4 months. Results will then indicate if a tapeworm treatment is required and this can be incorporated into the winter worming regime.

There are many other parasites of horses, namely Bots, large strongyles, pinworm, lungworm etc but this is beyond the scope of this article. Worming plans need to be tailored according to pasture, paddock management, age of horses, stocking density and many other factors, there isn't a one size fits all!

Speak to your vet if you have concerns about any of these parasites and to create a tailored worming protocol specific to your scenario. This will help to reduce the rate of resistance developing on your pasture and maintain your horse's health in many years to come.


